

Forgery:

You bought a book that turned out to be a forgery. Unfortunately, you didn't know better when you started your collection. Delete your last collected book from your holdings and place it in the discard pile.

Theft:

A thief successfully came into your library's reading room and stole the most valuable book you own. If you have multiple books of the same value, the most recent book was the one that was stolen. Place them in the discard pile as they've disappeared from circulation forever.

Disaster:

A natural disaster occurred and you didn't get all of your books into a secure environment in time.

Delete the last two books you acquired from your holdings and place them in the discard pile as they have been irreparably damaged.

Donor:

You've acquired a wealthy benefactor. Select one book you need for your collection that's still available in the market. Add it to your holdings for free.

Discovery:

You found an item in your library you didn't know was there. Select one book from the available books originating in your country and add it to your collection for free.

Swap:

A curator at the library from the country to your right offered to swap one of their books for one of yours.

Choose a book from any of their holdings and give them any one of your books in return. Or, if you don't want any of their books, politely decline their offer.

Grant:

Your library attracted an international funder. Add three CREDITS to your holdings to allow you to purchase whatever book you would like from the market during the next century's turn courtesy of a grant.

Occupation:

The country sitting to your left occupied your country briefly; they were in power just long enough to take your country's patrimony. Give them any books you collected from your country.
